- Continued work on our community health assessment, Mobilizing for Action through Planning & Partnership (MAPP) with the completion of our quality of life survey.
- Began work to develop an agency strategic plan.
- Over 300 residents attended our second annual Longest Day of Play (LDOP) event to promote an increase in physical activity.
- Complete construction and relocated into a new facility, located at 1180 Glensboro Road.
- Successfully completed a Vaccine for Children (VFC) Quality Assurance Site Visit with a score of 95%.
- Enforced Board of Health regulation 2010-01 with over 50 people completing the food manager training and assigning approximately 500 food handler permits.
- Hosted our annual drive-thru flu shot clinic as a public health preparedness exercise. Approximately 400 people were vaccinated.
- Selected by the Department for Public Health to provide the Governor and First Lady with their seasonal flu vaccinations.
- Implemented the use of a new WIC EBT process which allows clients to receive a plastic card with benefits instead of the prior paper method.
- Assisted in the progress and funding for continued work to establish a Free Medical Clinic for uninsured adults with chronic medical conditions.
- Provided ~800 vaccinations at our annual rabies vaccination clinic in collaboration with the Humane Society and local Veterinarians.

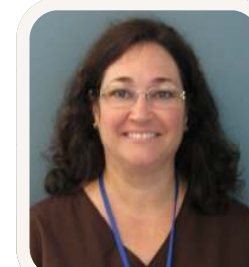
